Why Use This Study Resource?

I have been meditating on the life of King Josiah for nearly half a decade, and the Holy Spirit has breathed incredible truths into my life from this mighty king over the years.

For example, before I travelled to Africa for the first time in 2017, the Holy Spirit spoke prophetically to me that, in the same way that King Josiah purged the land of demonic worship, so I would also deliver people from satanic strongholds and devil worship. I took God's Word seriously and meditated on the life of King Josiah, seeing myself purge the land of demonic worship and satanic forces until I saw myself purging the land of demonic forces—my faith was strong in this area!

During the trip to Africa, I witnessed some of the most spectacular displays of the power of God that I had ever experienced. It was awesome. Our team watched as both individuals and entire groups were delivered from the power of Satan with nothing but a word. As the Gospel was preached, demons evacuated their hosts and we saw nearly one thousand people born again in less than two weeks. Glory to God!

I shared that story with you to encourage you that studying the lives of different people in the Bible yields multiple levels of benefits to the believer.

First, our faith grows as we begin to see ourselves doing what they did. Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of God (Romans 10:17). We need to see ourselves in their shoes. We need to imagine and envision God doing the miraculous through us in the same way He did through Peter, Elisha, Paul, Philip, and all the others. The only way to cement these

realities deep into our spirits is to take the time to study out the lives of these heroes with the Holy Spirit guiding us in our Bible times.

Second, the Holy Spirit often breathes *prophetic identity* to us in connection with Bible heroes in order to reveal and catalyze His purpose for our lives. When the Lord spoke to me about King Josiah in 2017, He was calling out a new part of my identity—something that I didn't know much about before. Certainly, casting out demons is supposed to be part of every believer's testimony, but I had a fresh revelation from God that built up my faith in this area, and I watched as God confirmed His Word.

Organization

I've organized the account of King Josiah into three columns—I use the **center column** to handwrite my notes, definitions, word studies, cross references, etc., and I've double spaced the **Bible text in the outer columns** to make it easy to read and mark up. The headings in the center columns are added by me and are not part of the original text.

I've arranged the text so that when unique content occurs, which it does frequently in these passages, you will see only one column of Scripture either on the 2 Kings side (on the left) or the 2 Chronicles side (on the right). When an event occurs in both books, the page contains parallel texts. My whole goal in writing this was to create a better way for myself to study out the life of King Josiah more deeply, and I am grateful for the opportunity to share this free resource with you. I have found that studying the Bible in this way yields a much deeper experience and creates an opportunity to dialogue with my Heavenly Father about His Word. I pray this method will be helpful to you, too.

Why the Amplified Classic Bible?

I chose to study the life of King Josiah in the *Amplified Bible, Classic Edition* because I love how this translation makes many of the Hebrew words explicit in the English language.

Although I zealously employ and highly recommend an interlinear resource (like *Blue Letter Bible*) for deeper word studies, the *AMPC* provides a great context for a more comprehensive word study than most of the other English translations, while staying close to the KJV text.

One of the most important benefits from spending time in the Bible is learning how to hear God's voice as you read, and learning how to stop, listen, and engage with the Father as you read. The Bible isn't written to your head; it is written to your heart. It is only through ongoing relationship and intimacy with the Author of the Bible is one able to truly yield the glorious fruit that is woven throughout its pages.

Go deep with God. Don't be afraid to ask Him questions; He can handle your doubts and concerns. He isn't offended when you ask Him about His Book. My deepest desire is that you grow deeper in love, full of the Holy Spirit in all wisdom and understanding, and that you come into the fullness of what God has for you as you study out the life of this great man of God, King Josiah.

Introduction

2 Kings 22

1 Josiah was eight years old when he began his thirty-oneyear reign in Jerusalem. His mother was Jedidah daughter of Adaiah of Bozkath.

2 He did right in the sight of the Lord and walked in all the ways of David his [forefather], and turned not aside to the right hand or to the left.

2 Chronicles 34

1 Josiah was eight years old when he began his thirty-one-year reign in Jerusalem.

2 He did right in the sight of the Lord and walked in the ways of David his father [forefather] and turned aside neither to the right hand nor to the left.

Josiah's Eighth Year: The King Purges the Land

2 Chronicles 34

3 For in the eighth year of his reign, while he was yet young [sixteen], he began to seek after and yearn for the God of David his father [forefather]; and in the twelfth year he began to purge Judah and Jerusalem of the high places, the Asherim, and the carved and molten images.

4 They broke down the altars of the Baals in his presence; the sun-images that were high above them he hewed down; the Asherim and the graven images and the molten images he broke in pieces and made dust of them and

strewed it upon the graves of those who sacrificed to them.

5 Josiah burned the bones of the [idolatrous] priests upon their altars, and so cleansed Judah and Jerusalem.

6 So he did in the cities of
Manasseh, Ephraim, and
Simeon, even to Naphtali, in
their ruins round about [with
their axes],

7 He broke down the altars and the Asherim and beat the graven images into powder and hewed down all the sunimages throughout all the land of Israel. Then he returned to Jerusalem.

Josiah's Eighteenth Year: Workers Sent to Rebuild the House of the LORD

2 Kings 22

3 In the eighteenth year of
King Josiah, he sent Shaphan
son of Azaliah, the son of
Meshullam, the scribe, to the
Lord's house, saying,

4 Go up to Hilkiah the high priest, that he may count the money brought into the house of the Lord, which the keepers of the door have gathered from the people.

5 And let them deliver it into the hands of the workmen who have oversight of the Lord's house, to give to the laborers engaged in the

2 Chronicles 34

8 In the eighteenth year of
Josiah's reign, when he had
purged the land and the
[Lord's] house, he sent
Shaphan son of Azaliah, and
Maaseiah governor of the
city, and Joah son of Joahaz,
the recorder, to repair the

King Josiah Purges the Land and Restores True Worship

2 Kings 23

1 King Josiah sent and gathered to him all the elders of Judah and of Jerusalem.

2 The king went up to the house of the Lord, and with him all the men of Judah, all the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the priests, the prophets, and all the people, both small and great. And he read in their ears all the words of the Book of the Covenant, which was found in the Lord's house.

3 The king stood [on the platform] by the pillar and made a covenant before the Lord—to walk after the Lord and to keep His

2 Chronicles 34

29 Then King Josiah sent and gathered all the elders of Judah and Jerusalem.

30 And [he] went up into the house of the Lord, as did all the men of Judah, the inhabitants of Jerusalem, the priests, the Levites, and all the people, great and small; and he [the king] read in their hearing all the words of the Book of the Covenant that was found in the Lord's house.

8 And [Josiah] brought all the [idolatrous] priests out of the city of Judah and defiled the high places, where the priests had burned incense, from Geba to Beersheba [north to south], and broke down the high places both at the entrance of the Gate of Joshua the governor of the city and that which was on one's left at the city's gate.

9 However, the priests of the high places were not allowed to sacrifice upon the Lord's altar in Jerusalem, but they ate unleavened bread among their brethren.

10 And Josiah defiled
Topheth, which is in the
Valley of Ben-hinnom [son of
Hinnom], that no man might
ever burn there his son or his
daughter as an offering to
Molech.

11 And he removed the horses that the kings of Judah had devoted to the sun from the entrance of the house of the Lord, by the chamber of Nathan-melech the chamberlain, which was in the area, and he burned the chariots of the sun with fire.

12 And the altars on the roof of the upper chamber of

Ahaz, which the kings of
Judah had made, and the
altars which Manasseh had
made in the two courts of the
house of the Lord, [Josiah]
pulled down and beat them in
pieces, and he [ran and] cast
their dust into the brook
Kidron.

13 And the king defiled the high places east of Jerusalem, south of the Mount of Corruption, which Solomon the king of Israel had built for Ashtoreth the abominable [goddess] of the Sidonians, for Chemosh the abominable god of the Moabites, and for Milcom the abominable [god] of the Ammonites.

14 He broke in pieces the pillars (images) and cut down the Asherim and replaced them with the bones of men [to defile the places forever].

15 Moreover, the altar at
Bethel, the high place made
by Jeroboam son of Nebat,
who made Israel to sin, that
altar with the high place
Josiah tore down and broke in
pieces its stones, beating
them to dust, and burned the
Asherah.

16 And as Josiah turned, he saw the tombs across on the mount, and he sent and brought the bones out of the tombs and burned them upon the altar and defiled it, in fulfillment of the word of the

Lord which the man of God prophesied, who predicted these things [about this altar, naming Josiah before he was born].

17 Josiah said, What is that monument I see? The men of the city told him, It is the tomb of the man of God who came from Judah and foretold these things that you have just done against the altar of Bethel.

18 He said, Let him alone; let no man move his bones. So they let his bones alone, with the bones of the prophet that came out of Samaria.

19 Also Josiah took away all the houses of the high places

in the cities of Samaria which the kings of Israel had made, provoking the Lord to anger, and he did to them all that he had done in Bethel.

20 He slew all the priests of the high places that were there upon the altars and burned men's bones upon them [to defile the places forever]. Then he returned to Jerusalem.

King Josiah Restores the Passover

2 Kings 23

21 The king commanded all the people, Keep the Passover to the Lord your God, as it is

2 Chronicles 35

1 Josiah kept the Passover to the Lord in Jerusalem; they killed the Passover lamb on written in this Book of the Covenant.

22 Surely such a Passover was not held from the days of Israel's judges, even in all the days of the kings of Israel or Judah.

23 But in the eighteenth year of King Josiah, this Passover was kept to the Lord in Jerusalem.

the fourteenth day of the first month.

2 He appointed the priests to their positions and encouraged them in the service of the house of the Lord.

3 To the Levites who taught all Israel and were holy to the Lord he said: Put the holy ark in the house which Solomon son of David king of Israel, built; it shall no longer be a burden carried on your shoulders. Now serve the Lord your God and His people Israel.

4 Prepare yourselves according to your fathers' houses by your divisions,

after the directions of David king of Israel and of Solomon his son.

5 And stand in the holy court of the priests according to the sections of the fathers' families of your kinsmen, the common people, and let there be a section of the Levites [to attend] to each division of the families of the people.

6 Kill the Passover lambs and sanctify yourselves and prepare for your brethren to do according to the word of the Lord by Moses.

7 Then Josiah contributed to the lay people lambs and kids of the flock as Passover offerings for all who were

present, to the number of 30,000, and 3,000 young bulls—all from the king's possessions.

8 And his princes gave for a freewill offering to the people, to the priests, and the Levites. Hilkiah, Zechariah, and Jehiel, chief officers of God's house, gave the priests for the Passover offerings 2,600 [lambs and kids] and 300 bulls.

9 Conaniah also, and
Shemaiah and Nethanel his
brothers, and Hashabiah,
Jeiel, and Jozabad, chiefs of
the Levites, gave to the
Levites for Passover offerings
5,000 [lambs and kids] and
500 bulls.

10 When the service was ready, the priests stood in their place and the Levites in their divisions as the king commanded.

11 They killed the Passover lambs, and the priests sprinkled the blood they received from the Levites who skinned the animals.

12 Then they removed the burnt offerings, that they might distribute them according to the divisions of the lay families to offer to the Lord, as directed in the Book of Moses. And so they did with the bulls.

13 And they roasted the Passover lambs with fire

according to the ordinance; and they cooked the holy offerings in pots, in caldrons, and in pans and carried them quickly to all the people.

14 Afterward [the Levites]
prepared for themselves and
the priests, because the
priests, the sons of Aaron,
were busy in offering the
burnt offerings and the fat
until night; so the Levites
prepared for themselves and
also for the priests, the sons
of Aaron.

15 The singers, the sons of
Asaph, were in their places
according to the command of
David, Asaph, Heman, and
Jeduthun the king's seer. And
the gatekeepers were at every

gate; they did not need to leave their service, for their brethren the Levites prepared for them.

16 So all the Lord's service was prepared the same day to keep the Passover and to offer burnt offerings upon the Lord's altar, as King Josiah commanded.

17 And the Israelites who were present kept the
Passover at that time, and the
Feast of Unleavened Bread
for seven days.

18 No Passover like it had been kept in Israel since the days of Samuel the prophet, even by any of the kings of Israel, as was kept by Josiah

and the priests, the Levites,
and all Judah and Israel who
were present, and the
inhabitants of Jerusalem.

19 In the eighteenth year of the reign of Josiah this Passover was kept.

Final Commentary on King Josiah

2 Kings 23

24 Moreover, Josiah put away
the mediums, the wizards, the
teraphim (household gods),
the idols, and all the
abominations that were seen
in Judah and in Jerusalem,
that he might establish the
words of the law written in

the book found by Hilkiah the priest in the house of the Lord.

25 There was no king like him before or after [Josiah] who turned to the Lord with all his heart and all his soul and all his might, according to all the Law of Moses.

26 Still the Lord did not turn from the fierceness of His great wrath, kindled against Judah because of all the provocations with which Manasseh had provoked Him.

27 And the Lord said, I will remove Judah also out of My sight as I have removed Israel, and will cast off this city, Jerusalem, which I have chosen, and the house, of which I said, My Name [and the pledge of My presence] shall be there.

King Josiah's Death

2 Kings 23

28 The rest of the acts of
Josiah, all that he did, are
they not written in the Book
of the Chronicles of Judah's
Kings?

29 In his days Pharaoh Necho king of Egypt went up against the king of Assyria to the river Euphrates. King Josiah went out against him, but he slew Josiah at Megiddo when he saw him.

2 Chronicles 35

20 After all this, when Josiah had prepared the temple,
Neco king of Egypt went out to fight against Carchemish on the Euphrates, and Josiah went out against him.

21 But [Neco] sent
ambassadors to [Josiah],
saying, What have I to do
with you, you king of Judah?
I come not against you this
day, but against the house

30 Josiah's servants carried him dead in a chariot from Megiddo, brought him to Jerusalem, and buried him in his own tomb. The people of the land anointed Jehoahaz son of Josiah king in his stead.

with which I am at war; and God has commanded me to make haste. Refrain from opposing God, Who is with me, lest He destroy you.

22 Yet Josiah would not turn away from him, but disguised himself in order to fight with him. He did not heed the words of Neco from the mouth of God, but came to fight with him in the valley of Megiddo.

23 And the archers shot King Josiah, and the king said to his servants, Take me away, for I am severely wounded.

24 So his servants took him out of the chariot and put him in his second chariot and

brought him to Jerusalem.

And he died and was buried in the tombs of his fathers.

All Judah and Jerusalem mourned for Josiah.

25 Jeremiah gave a lament for Josiah, and all the singing men and women have spoken of Josiah in their laments to this day. They made them an ordinance in Israel; behold, they are written in the Laments.

26 Now the rest of the acts of Josiah and his deeds, according to what is written in the Law of the Lord,

27 And his acts, from first to last, behold, they are written

in the Book of the Kings of Israel and Judah.
